Mayor Mike Timmer called the meeting to order and led those in attendance in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Councilman Bruns left the meeting in progress due to having a conflict of interest as a member of the Diamonds and Field Board. Mayor Timmer opened the public hearing on the proposal to approve the All-Play Ball Park transfer agreement. There was discussion on the terms of the agreement and the amount expected to be paid yearly by Diamonds and Fields as a part of the agreement. There was a question about the junior high baseball team still being able to use the facilities and concerns expressed about the use of golf carts being allowed on

the property. It was stated that as a part of the agreement, Diamonds and Fields will continue to direct activities at the complex and requests will be responded to as they arise. Councilwoman Johnson and the City Council expressed their thanks to the Diamonds and Field Board of Directors for all of the work done to make the complex a reality. Citizen Kreg Hoppenworth stated how amazed he is at what has been built and in awe by what has been ac-complished at the site. After there was no further discussion, Mayor Timmer closed the public hearing. There was a motion by Goodrich,

seconded by Cuvelier to adopt Resolution 1106 approving the All Play Ball Park property transfer agreement with Diamonds and Fields, an Iowa nonprofit corporation. Upon roll call vote, ayes: Cuvelier, Goodrich, Johnson, and Simon.

MINUTES AND PROCEEDINGS OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE BUTLER COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS HELD ON JULY 18, 2023.

Meeting called to order at 9:00 A.M. by Chairman Greg Barnett with members Rusty Eddy and Wayne Dralle present. Moved by Dralle sec-ond by Eddy to approve the agenda. All ayes. Motion carried.

Minutes of the previous meet-ing were read. Motioned by Eddy, second by Dralle to approve the minutes as read. All ayes. Motion carried.

No public comment was received. Motioned by Eddy, second by Dral-le to open a Third Public Hearing to consider a Hazardous Liquid Pipeline Ordinance. Kim Junker thanked the board and expressed her safety concerns with the pipeline. Jeff Reints noted that there is a better option available than a pipeline to capture CO2, and is currently working with a company on that. Other concerns addressed included safety and destroying farmland. County Attorney, David Kuehner, stated that his legal advice is to not do something if you know you are going to get sued. He noted that Shelby County is going through the process currently and may file with the lowa Supreme Court to obtain on ruling on the County's role. Kuehner cautioned that we should wait and not spend the money on a lawsuit until we know what the ruling is. Timothy Whipple, Ahlers and Cooney, commented that Bremer and Emmet Counties are ahead of us in the ordinance process and indicated every county that has adopted a similar ordinance has been sued. He said there is no pressing reason to move forward and that Butler County should take the County Attorney's advice and wait in order to see what happens with other counties. Barnett thanked everyone for attending the public hearing and commented that the adoption will be on the next week's agenda. Motioned by Dralle, Second by Eddy to close the Public Hearing. All ayes. Motion carried. Board considered Heartland Gre-

enway LLC Easement Calculation Sheets regarding easement of-fers on the county bike trails. Matt Morris, Conservation Director, was

present to discuss the easements. No motion was made to accept the offers which then failed for a lack of

a motion. Board reviewed Public Health Annual Sub-Fund Agreement. Jennifer Becker, Public Health Director, discussed the agreement. Motioned by Eddy, second by Dralle to approve the Public Health Annual Sub-Fund Agreement for FY24. All ayes. Motion carried.

Board reviewed Treasurer Semi-Annual Report. Motioned by Eddy, second by Dralle to approve the Treasurer Semi-Annual Report. All ayes. Motion carried.

Jon Uhlenhopp was recognized for his retirement from Secondary Roads Department after 45 Years of Service. John Riherd, County Engineer, presented him with a plaque. Uhlenhopp will finish his career with

the county at the end of July. Board considered utility permit for Iowa Regional Utilities Association for new service crossing @ 14705 300th Street. Riherd discussed the project and recommended approval. Motioned by Dralle, second by Bar-nett. All ayes. Motion carried.

Riherd, provided an Engineer's Update. A notification was received from the bridge inspector that a bridge on Evergreen and 180th needs to be closed. It is on schedule for replacement in the next fiscal year but will remain closed until it is replaced.

Motioned by Barnett, second by Dralle to approve claims. All ayes. Motion carried.
