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MINUTES City of Parkersburg

CITY OF PARKERSBURG OCTOBER 1, 2018 PARKERSBURG, IOWA The City Council of the City of Parkersburg, Iowa met in regular session on Monday, October 1, 2018 at 7:00 P.M. at the Parkersburg Civic Center. Council members present: Bruns, Knock, Thorne, and Timmer. Absent: Schuck. Mayor Perry Bernard called the meeting to order and led those in attendance in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance. Motion by Thorne, seconded by Bruns to approve the minutes. Upon vote, all eyes. Motion by Bruns, seconded by Thorne to approve the bills. Upon vote, all eyes. Rod Luhring and Scott Barrett reviewed recent public works activities. Scott stated his new truck has arrived and it was requested by the City Council to gather more information regarding trading in the trucks used by the department. Information about the city's water use permit, mosquito spraying, and the removal of an ash tree on 1st Street was discussed. There was also discussion about drainage issues east of Brookside Drive and possible solutions. Rod provided information about the sanitary sewer lining project and concerns at the lift stations because of the heavy rainfall received in September. There was a motion by Timmer, seconded by Bruns to approve of the FY2017 - 2018 Annual Urban Renewal Report. Upon vote, all eyes. There was a motion by Thorne, seconded by Bruns to approve the five day temporary liquor license for Beaver Meadows Golf & Country Club effective November 8. Upon vote, all eyes. Chris Luhring provided a map for a 5K fundraising race being planned. There was a motion by Timmer, seconded by Bruns to approve the "I Am the Road" 5K Fundraiser for mental health awareness on November 10th. Upon vote, all eyes. Chris Luhring introduced the next agenda items regarding the Community Development Block Housing Grant funds recently committed to the city. He stated the subsequent policies and Resolutions 990 through 995 are requirements of the grant that need to be satisfied in order to receive funds. There was a motion by Thorne, seconded by Bruns to adopt the Affirmative Fair Housing Policy to comply with the IEDA CDBG Housing grant requirements. Upon vote, all eyes. There was a motion by Bruns, seconded by Timmer to approve the alternative signatures for the Iowa Economic Development Authority CDBG Housing contract number 18-HSG-019. Upon vote, all eyes. There was a motion by Timmer, seconded by Thorne to adopt Resolution 990 adopting a citizen participation plan for the

City of Parkersburg CDBG Housing grant. Upon vote, all eyes. There was a motion by Bruns, seconded by Timmer to approve Resolution 991 adopting a code of conduct for the officers and employees of the city. Upon vote, all eyes. There was a motion by Timmer, seconded by Thorne to approve Resolution 992 adopting an Equal Opportunity Policy statement for the City of Parkersburg. Upon vote, all eyes. There was a motion by Timmer, seconded by Bruns to approve Resolution 993 adopting an excessive force policy by law enforcement agencies within the city's jurisdiction. Upon vote, all eyes. There was a motion by Bruns, seconded by Thorne to approve Resolution 994 adopting a procurement policy related to the implementation and administration of the IEDA CDBG award. Upon vote, all eyes. There was a motion by Bruns, seconded by Timmer to approve Resolution 995 adopting a residential anti-displacement and relocation assistance plan on behalf of the CDBG Housing grant. Upon vote, all eyes. There was a motion by Bruns, seconded by Thorne to adopt Resolution 996 approving the contract for services between the Iowa Northland Regional Council of Governments and the City for the IEDA Housing Fund: CDBG Housing Rehabilitation General Administration. Upon vote, all eyes. There was a motion by Bruns, seconded by Timmer to adopt Resolution 997 approving the contract for services between the Iowa Northland Regional Council of Governments and the City for the IEDA Housing Fund: CDBG Housing Rehabilitation Technical Services Administration. Upon vote, all eyes. Lee Gallentine provided an addendum to the water main engineering contract for Mayor Bernard and the City Council's review. Lee described the changes in the currently planned project compared to when the project began. No action was taken on the contract modification. There was a motion by Bruns, seconded by Thorne to open the public hearing to approve plans, specifications, form of contract, and engineer's estimate for the Railroad Street Water System Improvement Project No. 7476. Lee provided information regarding the traffic flow from Main Street during construction. He explained the alternates provided to the contractors in the plans in order to allow traffic flow to remain open and efficient during construction. There was a motion by Bruns, seconded by Timmer to close the public hearing. Upon vote, all eyes. There was a motion by Thorne, second-

ed by Bruns to approve the plans, specifications, form of contract, and engineer's estimate. Upon vote, all eyes. Lee provided the bid tabulations for the Railroad Street Water System Improvement Project No. 7476. Mayor Bernard and the City Council reviewed the information, alternates, and bids received. After discussion, there was a motion by Bruns, seconded by Thorne to adopt Resolution 998 awarding the watermain contract to Anstoetter Construction to include: the Division 2 base bid for the installation of eight inch watermain on Railroad Street from North Johnson Street to approximately Miners Street for \$1,014,530.11, Alternate A bid to include the paving of Railroad Street west of Highway 14 for \$65,033.40, Alternate B bid for sanitary sewer lining along Railroad Street for \$79,344.00, and the Alternate C bid to require phased construction for the efficient flow of traffic from the downtown business district for \$1,000.00, all pending CDBG funding review and approval. Ryan Rottinghaus, representing Parkersburg EMS, provided a reimbursement check for training in the amount of \$2,933.91 from the State of Iowa Bureau of Emergency and Trauma Services.
